For the past decade, GBT has been actively supporting and nurturing our local youth through the Junior Board program. GOLD was inspired by the Junior Board's concept but also takes into consideration the unique and specific interests of students in the field of technology. GBT further encourages local youth by offering internship opportunities and by our new NCK-Tech student sponsorship program. (We have already provided two students with full-ride scholarships for higher education, and they will have career opportunities with us as soon as they finish their schooling!)

A constant focus of ours is to help our local youth by providing them with opportunities to kick-start their careers, ultimately strengthening our local communities in the process!

Recipe of the Month:

Pumpkin Salted Caramels

Elegant, delicious, and incredibly easy to make. These treats are packed with the chewy goodness you'd expect from caramel, but they offer the sweet comfort and familiar flavor of a homemade pumpkin pie. Enjoy them individually or melt and drizzle some over fresh-picked apples for an unforgettable caramel apple experience.

Ingredients

1/2 cup (1 stick) Butter (salted)

1½ cups sugar

 $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon ground cinnamon

1/2 teaspoon ground ginger

1/4 teaspoon ground allspice

1 cup light corn syrup

1¹/₃ cup (14 oz. can) sweetened condensed milk

1/2 cup 100% Pumpkin puree

Directions

1. Prepare a 9-inch square pan by lightly buttering it or lining with parchment paper.

2. In a heavy 2 to 3-quart saucepan, melt butter over medium heat. Add sugar and spices: thoroughly blend.

3.Add corn syrup, sweetened condensed milk, and pumpkin—stirring well after each addition.

4.Continue to cook over medium heat stirring frequently to prevent scorching until the temperature of the mixture reaches 248°F (firm ball stage).

5.Remove from heat and pour mixture evenly into the prepared pan.

6. When cool, turn candy out of pan and cut into ¾" squares. Wrap individual pieces in 2¾-3" squares of nonstick aluminum foil or waxed paper. Store in an airtight container.

Note: 1 teaspoon Pumpkin Pie Spice could be substituted for cinnamon, ground ginger, and ground allspice.
