Last month marked a historic and monumental achievement for GBT as we successfully cut over the very last fiber customer to the GBT Network in our Incumbent Local Exchange Territory (ILEC). This milestone signifies that **every single customer** in our ILEC now enjoys access to the most reliable, state-of-the-art, and future-proof Internet service available - Fiber! While the journey to reach this point was neither quick nor easy, the result is undeniably worth the effort.

GBT's initial foray into fiber began in the late 80s, focusing on toll/transport. Over the subsequent 35 years and an investment exceeding \$50 million in total capital, this fiber infrastructure has extended its reach to every location within our ILEC territory that holds a demand and necessity for a fiber connection.

The significance of this achievement was captured with a special family in our cooperative—the Brenner family, who were our last customers to transition to the GBT Fiber network. Ben Brenner, a GBT Board member from 1976-2006, played a pivotal role in the Cooperative's initial fiber deployment under his

guidance. GBT's current Board President Jim Jecha, also part of the 1988 Board that made this decision, has given approval for every piece of fiber laid in our footprint today.

With GBT's StreamIT TV, we wanted to highlight a couple features that can enhance your experience during events like March Madness.


1. With a GBT Internet & StreamIT TV connection,

you can watch the games on many different devices. Long gone are the days of needing cables to hook into a set-top box so you can get the programming. Now if your device has GBT Internet and can download the StreamIT app, you can watch the games wherever you'd like. If you want to set TV's side-by-side you can do that!

- 2. You can watch the games on an iPad or Computer (if you're doing this from your work computer, just don't tell your boss, or let them know we gave you the idea!) The link to login is www.streamitgbta.net
- 3. Did you know there is a recently watched feature just below the guide? This feature allows you to quickly go back and forth from channel to channel, and if you hover over a specific channel, it will even show you what is currently playing. This allows you to see if the game is back on and/or if the commercials are still running.
- 4. Every StreamIT account comes with 50 hours of DVR. If you can't watch the game live, don't forget to record it and watch it later. You can even watch recordings on your mobile device 5 minutes after a program has started!

WTVE gives you the ability to watch your favorite shows and programs when you are not at home! Nominating Process 2024

The Annual Meeting of The Golden Belt Telephone Association, Inc. will be April 17, 2024, at the GBT Corporate Office, Rush Center, Kansas, from 5:00-6:30 p.m.

In accordance with Section 4.4 of the Bylaws of The Golden Belt Telephone Association, Inc., the Board shall appoint a Nominating Committee, who shall be selected from the Districts from which Trustees are to be elected. At least two candidates shall be nominated by the Committee for each district up for election. Any fifteen (15) or more members of a District acting together may make other nominations by petition, and the Secretary shall post such nominations at the same place where the list of nominations made by the committee is posted.

The following Districts will be up for election: District 3 – Beeler and Ness City; District 7 – Garfield and Lewis. The Nominating Committee of Darrell Brenner, Blaine Vogel, and Bob Walker for District 3; and Jill Cross and Greg Hinman for District 7; will meet March 5, 2024, to determine the nominee slate for presentation at the Annual Meeting.



Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) is Winding Down

Without additional funding from Congress, the allotted \$14.2 billion to fund the ACP is projected to run out in April 2024. (This is an estimate and may change.) Households now receiving the monthly ACP Internet discount will continue to receive the benefit until ACP funds run out, as long as the household remains enrolled in the program. After ACP funds run out, households participating in the ACP will not longer receive the ACP discount. Details, visit www.fcc.gov/ACP.

Recipe of the Month:

Bird's Nest Cookies

Ingredients

Milk chocolate chips
Peanut butter chips
Fried chow mein noodles:
Chocolate or malted milk eggs

Instructions

Step 1. Melt chocolate and peanut butter chips:

Melt chocolate and peanut butter chips together in the microwave.

Step 2. Add noodles: Transfer mixture to a large bowl and gently stir in noodles.

Step 3. Scoop nests: Spoon heaping portions onto baking sheet lined with parchment paper. Make a well in the center of each.

Step 4. Add chocolate eggs: Top with chocolate eggs. Let the chocolate set before serving.

Variations for Birds Nest Cookies

Flavored chips: Swap the peanut butter chips with butterscotch, caramel, or other flavored chips as preferred.

Chocolate: Milk chocolate adds sweetness to these chocolaty treats. Feel free to substitute with semisweet, bittersweet, or dark chocolate chips, if preferred.

Chow mein noodles: If you can't find chow mein noodles, substitute with pretzel sticks, cornflakes, or puffed rice cereal.

Mix-ins: Fold in mini chocolate chips, toasted coconut, chopped peanuts and more for additional texture and flavor.

Toppings: Swap the chocolate eggs for jelly beans or peanut M&M's if needed.

Want to add some color? Substitute the chocolate and peanut butter chips with colorful candy melts for a pastel version.
